Full-text articles from scholarly (peer-reviewed) journals and reference sources.

General Reference Gold Center

A general interest database that integrates a variety of sources - newspapers, reference books, magazines, and trade publications.

Gale Virtual Reference Library

Multi-subject virtual reference sources including multi-volume encyclopedias, dictionaries, and specialized reference sources.

General OneFile

Full-text articles from magazines, journals, news and reference sources, and multimedia materials including pod casts and audio files.
